



Tenure-Track Faculty Position in Cell Biology

The Department of Biological Sciences at the **University of Notre Dame** invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in the area of cell biology. Research areas of strength in the Department include cancer biology, the cytoskeleton and cell division, neuroscience, vision, and cell signaling. Strong infrastructure includes the AAALAC-accredited Freimann Animal Facility, Center for Zebrafish Research, Notre Dame Integrated Imaging Facility, Keck Center for Transgene Research, Center for Rare and Neglected Diseases, and the Center for the Study of Biocomplexity. Hiring is expected at the Assistant Professor level; however, exceptional mid-career candidates will be considered. Successful candidates will have a demonstrated record of research accomplishments and interest in collaborative and interdisciplinary research. The new faculty member will be expected to teach one undergraduate course and develop one graduate course per year. The position includes an attractive salary, competitive start-up package, and laboratory space tailored to the successful candidate's research needs.
